Section 17 of the Children Act 1989 imposes a general duty on local authorities to safeguard and promote the welfare of "children in need" in their area. To fulfil this duty section 17 gives local authorities the power to provide support, including accommodation and financial subsistence to families with "children in need", even if they have no recourse to public funds.
